When I exclaimed how happy I

was that she had decided to get treatment, she responded that coming to the needle exchange had given her the courage to seek treatment. "When you said to me that the syringe exchange was a step to being safe and a way to stay healthy, I decided I was going to stop using. I came to the syringe exchange because I wanted clean syringes; I got so much more. There is a feeling of acceptance here. I took your flyer and the bus out to Rainforest Recovery and I am going into treatment tomorrow." I wished Anne well and the best of luck with her forthcoming treatment."

A Positive Turn

When Andy first arrived at the hospital he wasn't too worried. He just felt off. Without much concern, doctors would assume that he had caught a nasty case of the flu, and send him on his way. But he didn't get better. Finally, weeks later, Andy went back to the hospital and requested that a full work up be done. Just hours later Andy sat in a small hospital room, alone, struggling to comprehend his results. Andy would be officially diagnosed HIV positive in the spring of 2012.

Andy would soon find out that he was infected by a boyfriend who did not disclose his status. Devastated, Andy would later remark that this felt like one of the most significant cases of broken trust in his life. Over the next few years Andy struggled to maintain his HIV medication regimen, battled with substance misuse and retreated from all social support. It wasn't until Andy landed in the hospital again that he realized something needed to change.

Upon his release and with a new fervor for life, Andy and his Case Manager set on a plan. Andy was connected with a local HIV Advocacy group. With the support of the group and the Four A's he began to feel empowered in sharing his story. Today, Andy maintains regular speaking engagements sharing his story and speaking on what we all can do to combat new HIV infections and the stigma this disease still carries. Today, Andy has an undetectable viral load and says he feels healthier than ever!

Andy says his new goal is to be a peer mentor for any person walking through a new HIV diagnosis. "A Case Manager is so important, but to have someone that knows, someone that can say, I've been thought this, and I'm here with you, I think that would make a big difference. I hope someday I make a big difference." - Andy, Four A's HIV Care Client
